## April – By the Numbers

- 45% of all eligible hospitals have received an EHR incentive payment for either MU or AIU
  - 45% have made a financial commitment to put an EHR in place
- Approximately 1 out of every 7 Medicare EPs are meaningful users of EHRs
- Approximately 1 out of every 5 Medicare and Medicaid EPs have made a financial commitment to an EHR
- 57% of Medicare EPs receiving incentives are specialists (non primary care)

# Providers Included

At the time of the analysis:

- 68,894 EPs had attested
  - 68,617 Successfully
  - 277 Unsuccessfully (167 EPs have resubmitted successfully)
- 1,292 Hospitals had attested
  - All successfully
  - All Medicare



# Highlights

- Very little Medicaid MU data
- On average all thresholds were greatly exceeded, but every threshold had some providers on the borderline
- Little difference between EP and hospitals
- Little difference among specialties in performance, but differences in exclusions and deferrals
- Data will be available on the CMS EHR Incentive Programs website, under the “Data and Reports” tab
