Hi, great, thanks Michelle, I do hope you feel better. So, welcome back everyone after I hope...what I hope was a nice long break. Today's agenda is going to be fairly focused so we may not end up taking the entire time but this is our last Workgroup call before the virtual hearings begin on Tuesday, January 26th. So, we have, on the agenda today want to talk a little bit about where the hearing is in its planning process so that the status of the panelists that have been invited and what have you.

ONC has put together a tentative virtual hearing agenda so we'll walk through that. We'll look at the overall API Task Force work plan and figure out after the hearings, maybe, you know, do some preliminary thinking around how we are going to be able to go about aggregating the information that we've learned and pulling together the final recommendations. So, with that, and again, I apologize I'm not up on the web portion but are we ready for the hearing status slide Michelle, is that...

Okay, great, thank you. So, this is how it's...the format is shaking out and ONC is in the process still of formalizing the invitation or confirming the invitations that have been sent out so not everyone...not every panel has been confirmed yet but as far as how the days are breaking down the first day will have these three panels. Panel one, consumer technologies and we'll hear from the software/hardware sector, API management, authentication and authorization and government.

Panel two will be consumer technologies and we will hear from social media, research and risk management, consumer services and government.

Panel three of day one will have industry sectors and we'll hear from the financial sector, consumer products, energy and telecommunications.

And then on day two that will be the healthcare specific portion of the stakeholders, the fourth panel, so the first panel of day two will be healthcare delivery and we will hear from a general care provider, a specialty care provider, payer and then we'll hear from the patient advocacy group.

And then panel five will be health IT vendors and we'll hear from the consumer advocacy, EHR vendor, health IT services and health Apps/services folks.

So, just from a broad perspective and during our last call when we were...during our administrative call when we were talking about how to break down these panels this is ultimately how that all shakes out.

So, just wanted to see if there were any high-level questions around the agenda. And further on in the call we'll go into a little bit more detail around, I think it's the next slide, that talks about how the time will break down but just from an overall perspective any thoughts or discussion, or questions for ONC around how these two days look? Okay, now I know that...

Sure. Okay, so I think it's going to be a lot of information, very comprehensive couple of days. You have in your set of materials the PDF or I'm sorry it's a doc with the questions that have been shared with the panelists so it would probably be a good idea...I know that we reviewed them a little bit, we ran out of time in our last call. So, some of us provided feedback through e-mail but, you know, obviously in preparation for the panelists you'll want to be familiar with what questions are being asked and be able to, you know, kind of guide how you want to pose your questions back to them accordingly.

I know that they are offered and we asked for some written, I don't want to say testimony because that sounds so formal, but we do ask for their responses in writing but that's certainly not something that they have to do and a lot of times as you know just with experience through hearings what they share orally may not always be represented in a written format.

So, all of the materials that we get, the written and what they share orally and certainly in response to our questions will all be part of what we'll consider as we finalize our recommendations for the April/May timeframe. So on...

Walk us through that process if that works out for you I think that would be great.

Okay, thank you, sorry. Yeah, so just a reminder and to reiterate a little bit of what Meg had said, we shared the questions with the people who we have invited. Typically we ask them to send a written testimony in advance. They are volunteers just as all of you are not everyone has time to do that but we do hope that they do. And we also ask for a Bio in advance. So we put together all of the Bios and we'll send those to you in advance of the meeting and any written testimony that we receive we'll send to you before the meeting as well.

Our hope is that you'll have time to at least review their Bios and any written testimony before the meeting so that you'll be able to come prepared with good questions. We know that...we only allow five minutes for each panelist and I will moderate that during the meeting trying to keep them as close to five minutes as possible.

So, how it will work is if there are five people on a panel each person will present, they'll do their five minutes so that will be a total of 25 minutes and then we'll open it up to all of you to ask questions and so that will work during the meeting.

If you are logged into Adobe Connect right now you should see at the top of your screen a little man with what looks like his hand raised and you just use that to raise your hand and it will put you in the queue to ask questions and I will just call on each of the Task Force members in the order that they have raised their hands to then ask questions of the panelists.

Because the panelists are only given five minutes they probably won't be able to answer all of the questions that we have sent them. So, you may want to, you know, ask them one of the questions that they may not have answered or, you know, it's really during that discussion though that we get a lot of good feedback from the hearing because they're able to dive a little bit deeper besides what has been presented in their testimony making sure that we get all of our questions answered and really fully understand where...understand their perspectives on the subject.

So, do you all see where the hand raising feature is up on the top there? And if you want to try and use it now might be a good time to kind of test it out. I see a few of you with your hand raised so that will just put you in the queue and I'll just call on you throughout the meeting.

We'll try to identify, once we have all of our panelists finalized the right amount of time for each panel and we'll try to stick to the time as best as possible. We may not need all of the time that you currently have blocked on the calendar but we wanted to make sure that we have enough time for a good

discussion. So, you know, as we finalize all of the panelists we may update the time of the meeting but for the moment we're going to keep all of the time blocked.

So, hopefully, you all heard me and does anyone have any additional questions about how the hearing will run?

Yeah, hi, this is David Yak, thanks for that. Is the whole meeting like questions and answers all conducted by audio or can we type in questions somewhere so that they're considered for being asked or how does the mechanics of asking questions work?

Typically I will just call out...so for example you have your hand raised right now, I'll just call on you to ask your question and we'll ask, you know, as many of the panelists to answer that question. But you can use...there is the public chat feature which some people from the public use as well to ask questions. Sometimes I will share the questions from the public if we have time in and if it seems relevant and if not then I'll share those questions after the fact, you know, it really will depend on the timing.

So, then on slide three the sample of a virtual hearing agenda looks like it just kind of walks through...we pulled out panel five to walk through the time allotted for the presentations and then certainly the question and answer discussion time after the fact. So, that builds out into two hours just kind of as an example. Any questions around that?

I think that what we've found, at least in my experience and Michelle I think it would be...I'd be interesting in hearing your comments on this, so the questions from us, from the Task Force in addition to I suppose anything that comes from the public, it all happens around that discussion time period. So, we don't get into necessarily the time of the presentation itself that's set aside for each of the panelists. We will reserve that until the end correct?

Yes, so after each panelist has presented we'll then open it up to questions from the Task Force. I'm sorry, did I misinterpret your question?

No I think you corrected it. So, after each panelist presents then we will question...we have an opportunity to question that particular panelist we don't have to hold our questions until everyone has spoken?

No we typically let each panelist on the panel go first. So, if there are five people on the panel we'll let all five go and then we open it up to questions.

Okay. Okay, sounds pretty easy. Any questions on that process? All right, thank you, very much, Michelle. So, the next slide, slide four goes over the proposed work plan and I suppose before we move onto this...because that's I think beyond the hearing topic, the document with the questions for the panelists, I know we haven't had enough time with the materials but are there any questions right off hand that would be worth discussing with this group or I suppose if there are questions we can e-mail afterward but I wanted to at least provide somewhat of an opportunity for discussion today if we needed to around those questions just to make sure that everyone understands what it is that is being asked and we can glean from that what we should expect to hear. Okay, good, I think the questions were well drafted so thank you to ONC for that but again, just wanted to have the opportunity here.

So, the proposed work plan we'll have the two hearings January 26th and 28th and then this slide basically outlines the rest of our activities until the Joint Committee meeting on April 19th where we will present our final recommendations to the Joint Policy and Standards Committees.

So, we will begin our work Tuesday, February 9th through a series of phone calls where we talk about what we've received, the documentation and the testimony. We'll try to glean from that key themes and begin drafting the recommendations. We'll have an opportunity, March 9th, to present draft recommendations and we'll get some initial feedback from both the Standards and Policy Committees and then have two more meetings after that to complete the work and integrate any additional questions or thoughts from either of the committees.

So, just from a pure process perspective I think it moves pretty quickly and there's a lot of work to do beginning after that February 9th meeting.

Secondly, are they going to all see all of the questions for each of the groups and are they going to be aware of the different groups that are going to be asked to present or are they only going to see their own questions and only be aware of the other panelists when they attend the meeting?

So, Michelle, I believe that all of these questions are available for everybody but we do share the questions specific to the panelists with the panelists before the hearing is that correct?

I think confirmation is pending on all of the panelists. Rose-Marie would you just verify that. I don't think we're looking for additional names I think we're just looking for confirmation from the invitations that have already been sent.

Yes, that's correct Meg we're...this is Rose-Marie, we're looking just for confirmation at this point. We have about seven pending confirmations and we've confirmed over 17 panelists to date.

I think we're marching toward what will likely be our shortest meeting. So, I think we're at the part of the agenda just for open discussion and questions, and this can certainly go beyond the hearing, any thoughts or topics that would be helpful for the group to talk about?

This is Aaron, I just wanted to share, you know, I'm sitting across from Rose-Marie we're at the NIST building right now and we're chatting a little bit about folks sort of approaching and asking about submitting written comment who won't necessarily be able to testify or, you know, won't be one of our panelists and she is going to...she's sharing with me an e-mail address to direct those people to send their inputs too.

So, I spoke to Rose-Marie and she is going to share like a FACA e-mail address that people can contribute to and I thought it would be useful

to hear that information with the other Task Force members so that they can pass it along to their network as well.

Well I think...so I do think that's a good point. So, anything that they...so Rose-Marie any instructions that you can help us with around facilitating folks who want to submit but then also, as with all of these, there is that public comment portion...there will be that public comment portion period at the end. So, if they wanted to, you know, provide a couple of, I think two minutes is the limit Michelle, is that right? But they can provide...

But they can provide some...spoken more during the public comment part of it and then certainly I think the written...that's always the most helpful for me. I think they would submit that too. So, thanks Rose-Marie for pulling that together and Aaron for pointing that out.
