

Standards Version Advancement Process

Approved Standards for 2023

The Standards Version Advancement Process (SVAP) permits health IT developers to voluntarily update health IT products certified under the Office of the National Coordinator for Health Information Technology (ONC) Health IT Certification Program to newer versions of adopted standards and implementation specifications. ONC has established an annual process to receive public input on eligible standards and implementation specifications that could be adopted through SVAP. ONC has completed the review and assessment of comments for the 2023 SVAP cycle and the following standards and implementation specifications versions have been approved for use in the ONC Health IT Certification Program. Health IT developers can begin voluntarily incorporating the standards and implementation specifications, listed in the table below, into their Certified Health IT Modules 60 days after this posting, or beginning on September 11, 2023. To further support implementation of the 2023 approved standards, ONC will update all the associated test data and tools.
