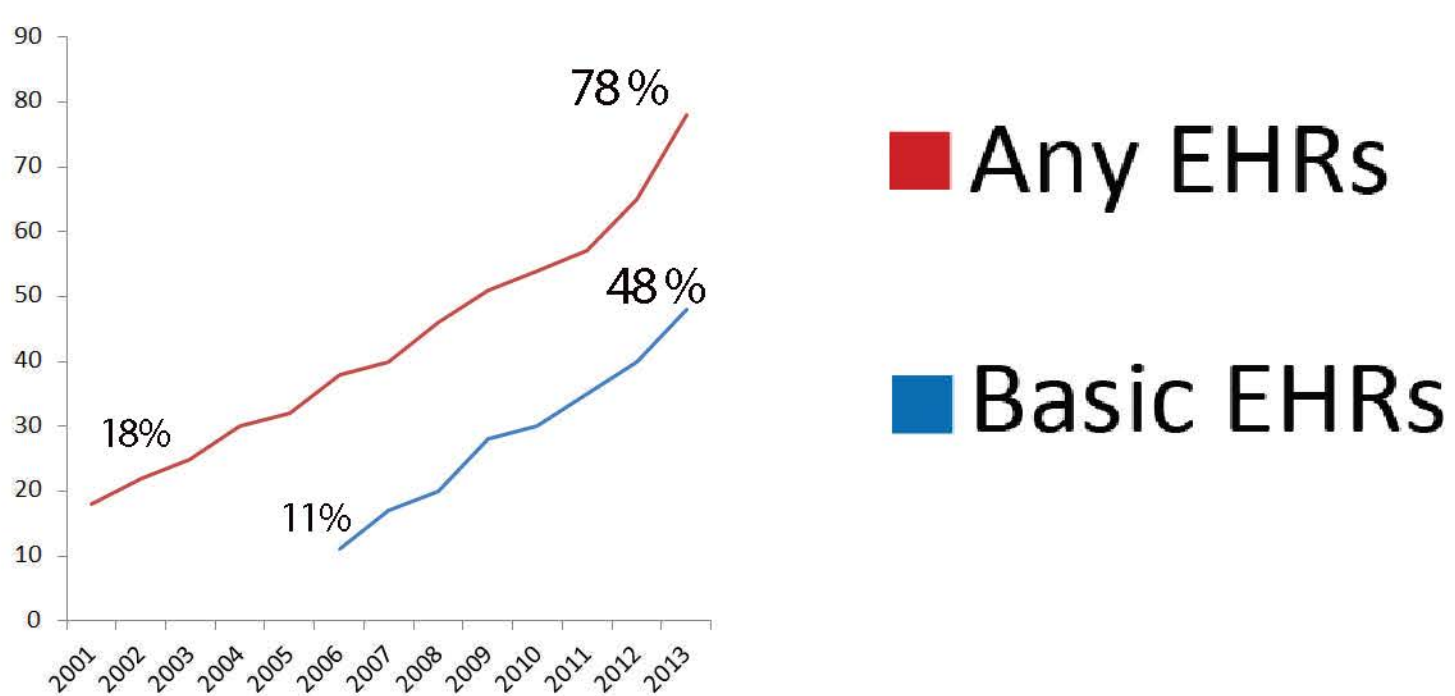


Physician Adoption of Electronic Health Records has steadily increased

78% of physicians use Any Type of EHR

48% of Physicians use a Basic EHR with certain advanced capabilities



That's up from 18% with any EHRs in 2001 and 11% with basic EHRs in 2006

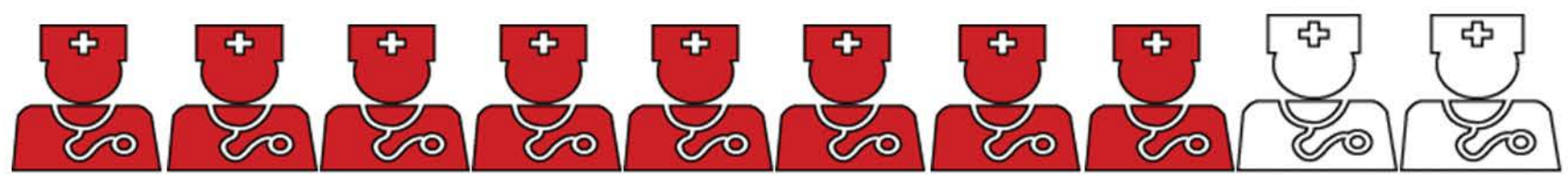

13% of physicians in 2013 intend to participate and have EHRs capable of supporting 14 of the Meaningful Use Stage 2 Core Objectives

Benefits according to Physicians



Almost 8 out of 10 physicians reported overall, improved patient care with EHR use

65% caught critical clinical lab values

62% caught potential medical error(s)

81% helped access a patient's chart remotely
