The Trusted Exchange Framework and Common Agreement™ (TEFCA™) is a framework for health information sharing across the U.S.

TEFCA makes it possible for public health agencies to receive case reports and request health records electronically from:

Healthcare providers

Other public health agencies

Labs

Pharmacies

Other TEFCA-connected organizations

How It Works

TEFCA provides a baseline of rules and technical requirements for connecting existing healthcare information networks (HINs) to each other, including the networks that public health agencies participate in, enabling secure network-to-network data sharing across HINs.



Public Health Benefits

Faster reporting

Receive information on reportable conditions and diseases from healthcare providers more quickly.

Less technical and legal complexity

Share data across the TEFCA network-of-networks, knowing that all participants play by the same rules for data sharing and protection.

Easier, more effective case validation

Electronically send requests for information – including to multiple providers simultaneously.

Participating in TEFCA Exchange

To participate in TEFCA, your agency will need to sign a TEFCA Framework Agreement with either:

- A QHIN
- A QHIN Participant
(i.e., an organization connected to a QHIN)
- A QHIN Subparticipant
(i.e., an organization connected to a Participant)
