### HITAC Comments Discussion

 Sheryl Turney led the Task Force in a review and discussion of the feedback from the full HITAC, including questions of public input protocol and discussion themes. The group discussed operating rules, the desire for an open process, and takeaways from the HITAC members' comments.

### Broader Intersection Discussion

 Alix Goss led the Task Force in a discussion of the broader intersection of clinical and administrative data, and how to integrate these new ideas into the draft paper. Particular topics included patient and caregiver involvement, use of data across the continuum (including public and population health) without adding burden, supporting specialty care, and including stakeholders at different levels of technical advancement.
