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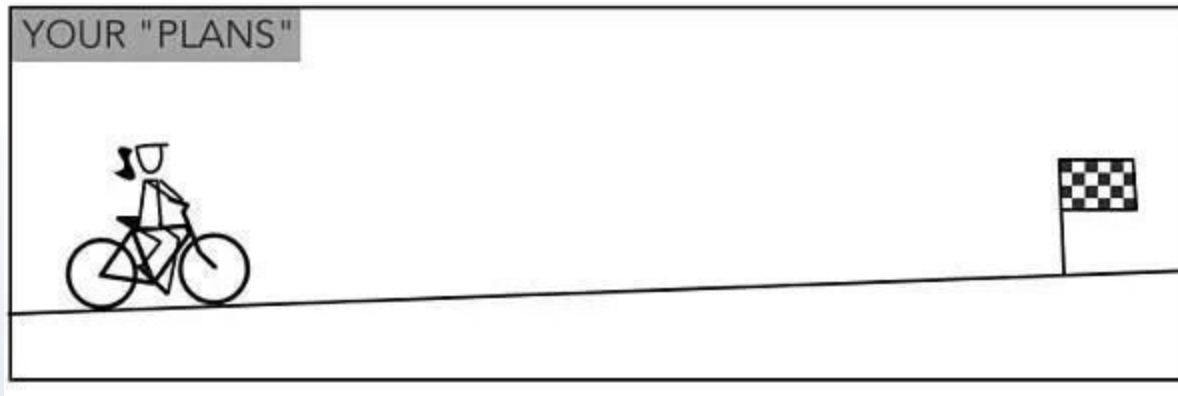
# What I have learned about Governing HIE

- Governing HIE is tough – we are still learning
- One size does not fit all.
- In many cases –depending on the use case - a plethora of ‘authorities’ influence the disclosure decision:
  - Applicable federal law (does this relate to a veteran?)
  - Applicable state law (is there something that applies from the state we are disclosing from?)
  - Applicable local policy considerations (can we redisclose this data we got from someone else?)
  - Applicable preferences of the care giver (did I promise this patient I wouldn’t share her information?)
  - Applicable privacy preferences of the individual (my ex-wife works there – could she use this against me in our custody battle?)
  - Applicable laws of the market (is there anybody willing to provide that service at a price point the market will bare?)
  - Applicable financial policies (if we behave this way will be able to sustain ourselves?)
  - ...and that is just the primary users of the data

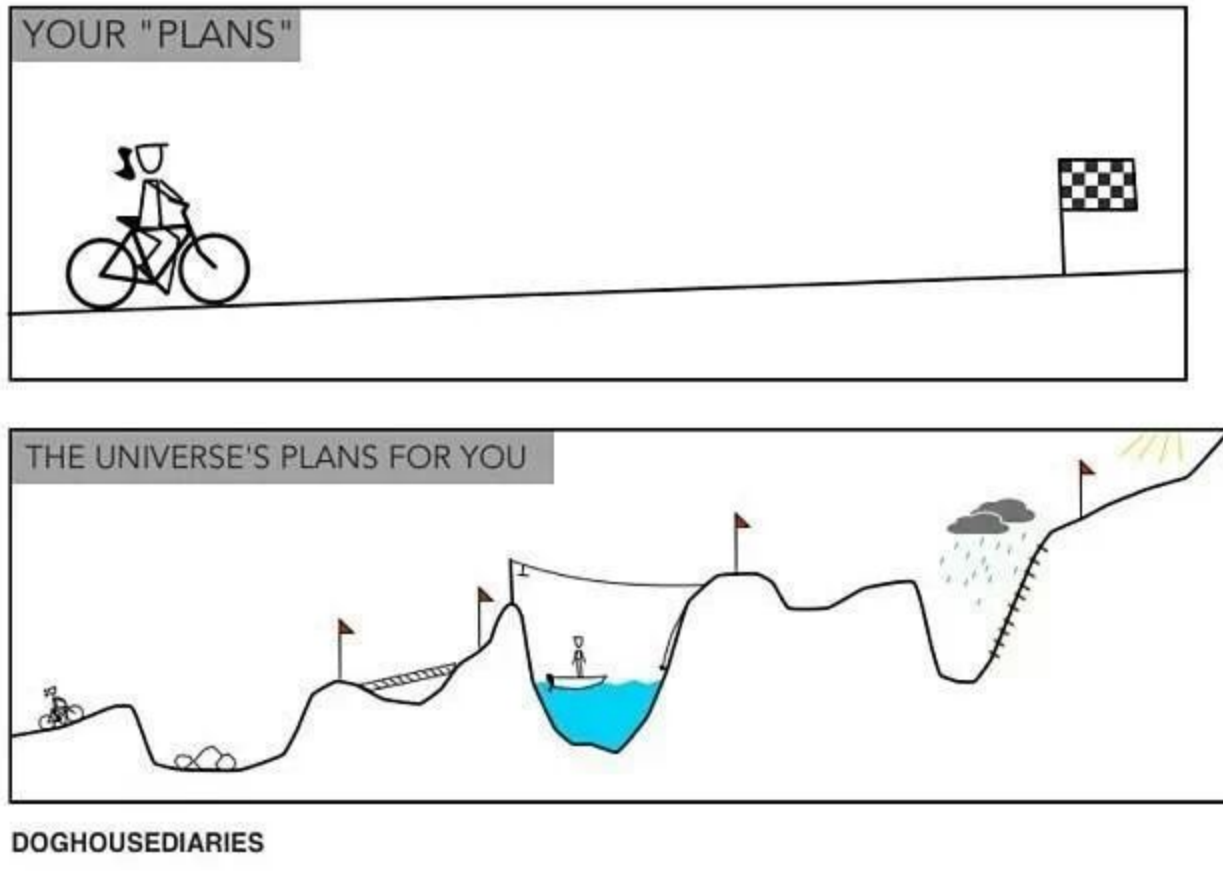
## Governance Heuristics

- How to recognize bad governance - the fewer of these ‘authorities’ that are involved the worse
- How to recognize good governance – supports options that allow local policy decision makers (the most local being the individuals themselves) to chose who they trust

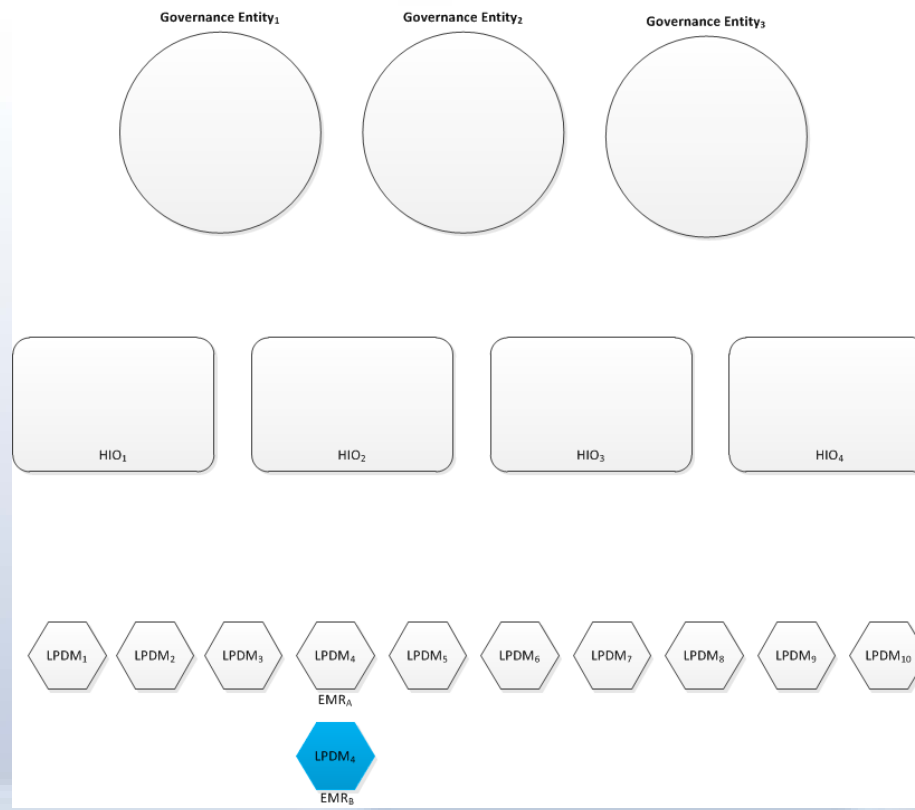

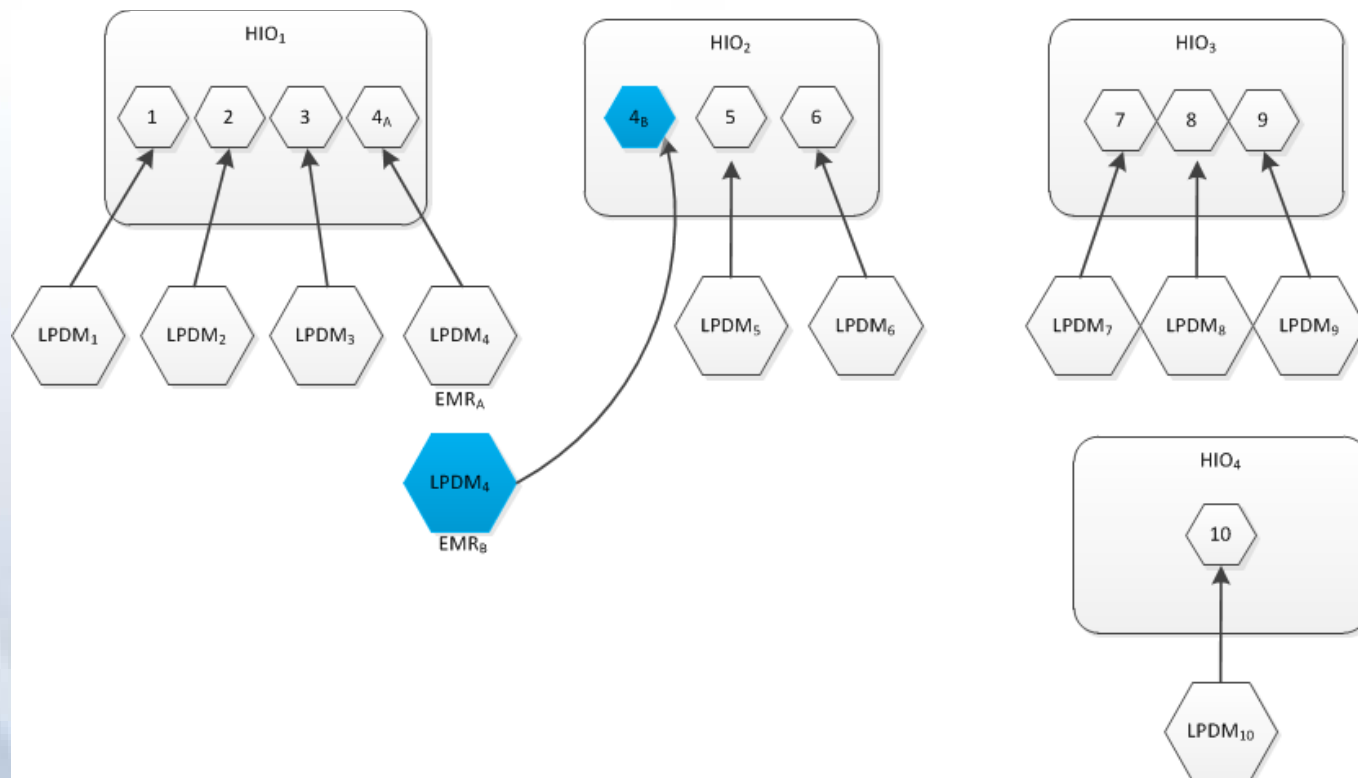
# Meaningful Use of emerging Governance entities

- Assume that there are only 3 governance entities qualified for a given use case.
- Assume that there are only 4 HIOs offering the services for a given use case.
- Assume that there are only 10 Local Policy Decision Makers (LPDMs).
- Assume that some LPDMs may belong to more than one HIO (ex: LPDM<sub>4</sub>).



# Relationship between LPDMs and HIOs

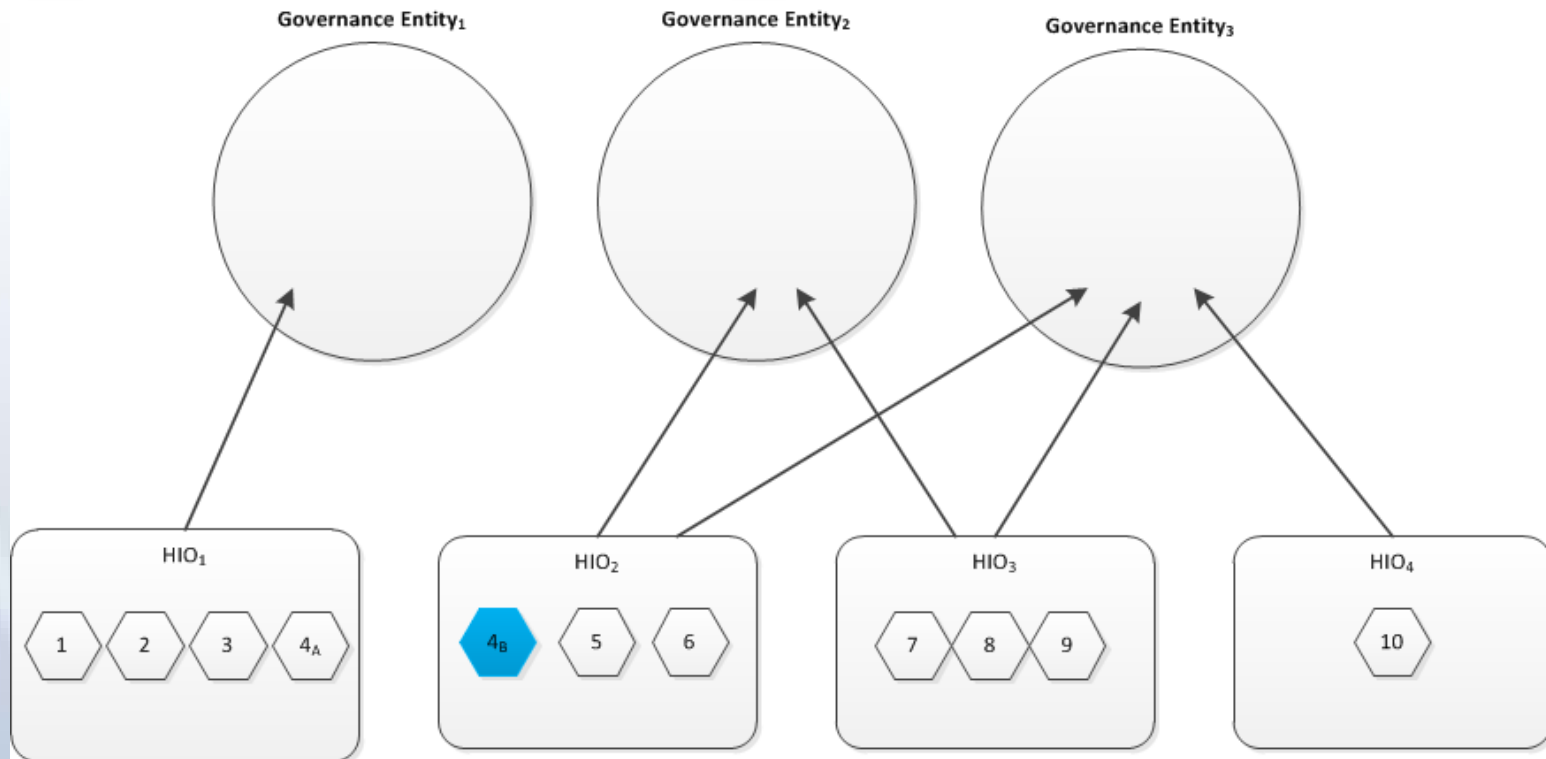
- A single HIO offers services to many LPDMs
- Some LPDMs are part of multiple HIOs
- Some HIOs are LPDMs of 1



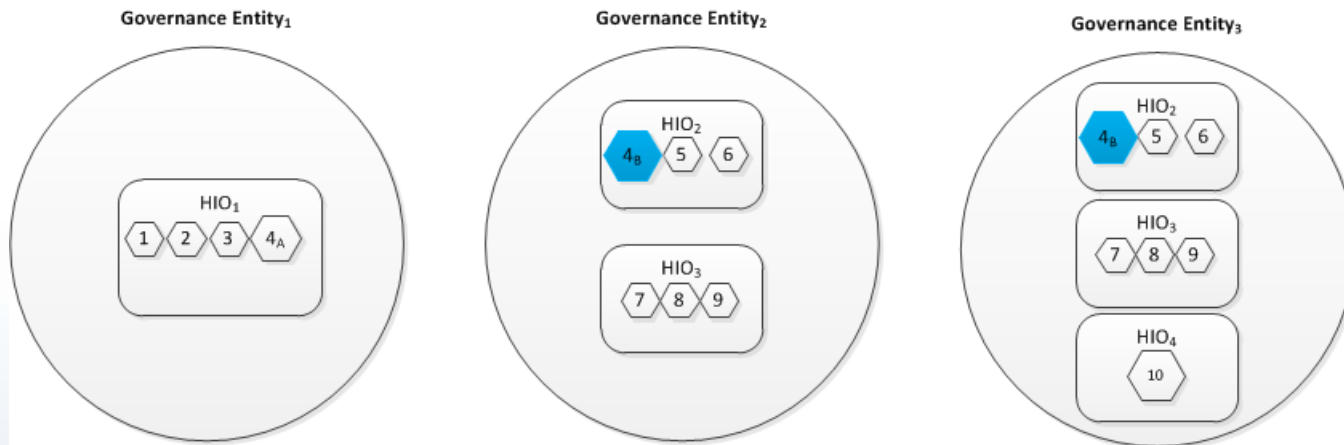


# Relationship between HIOs and GEs

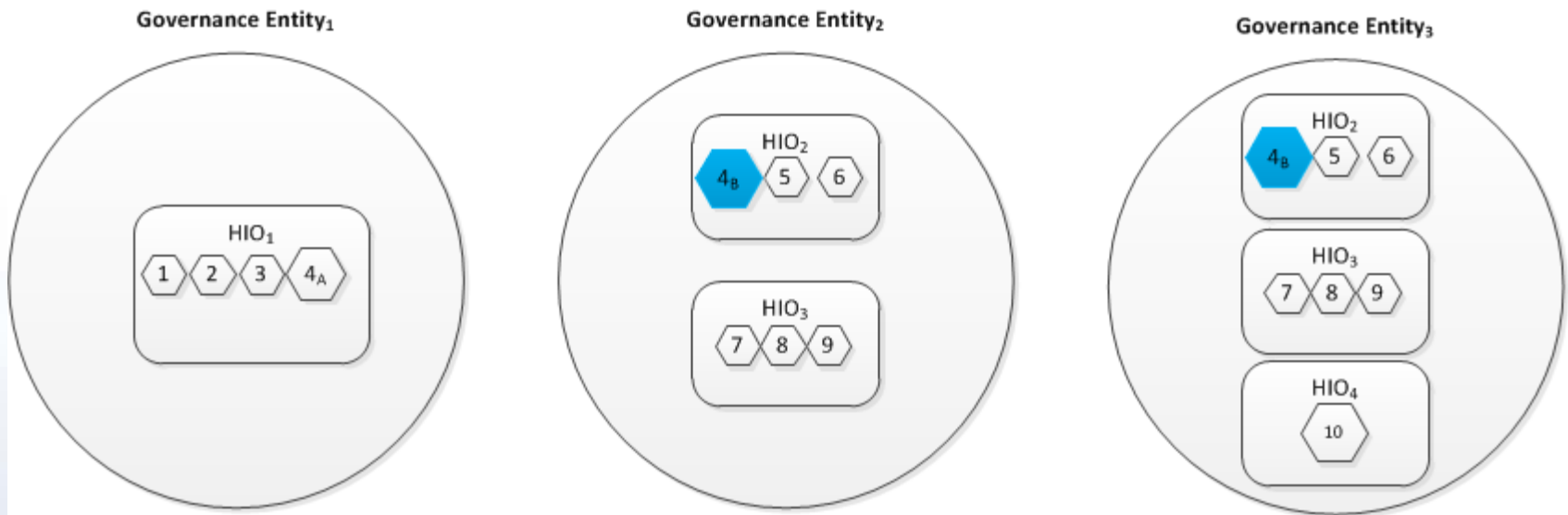
- Some HIOs are eligible to be part of only one Governance Entity ( $HIO_1$ )
- While others are eligible and belong to many ( $HIO_2$ )

# Then along comes LPDM<sub>11</sub>

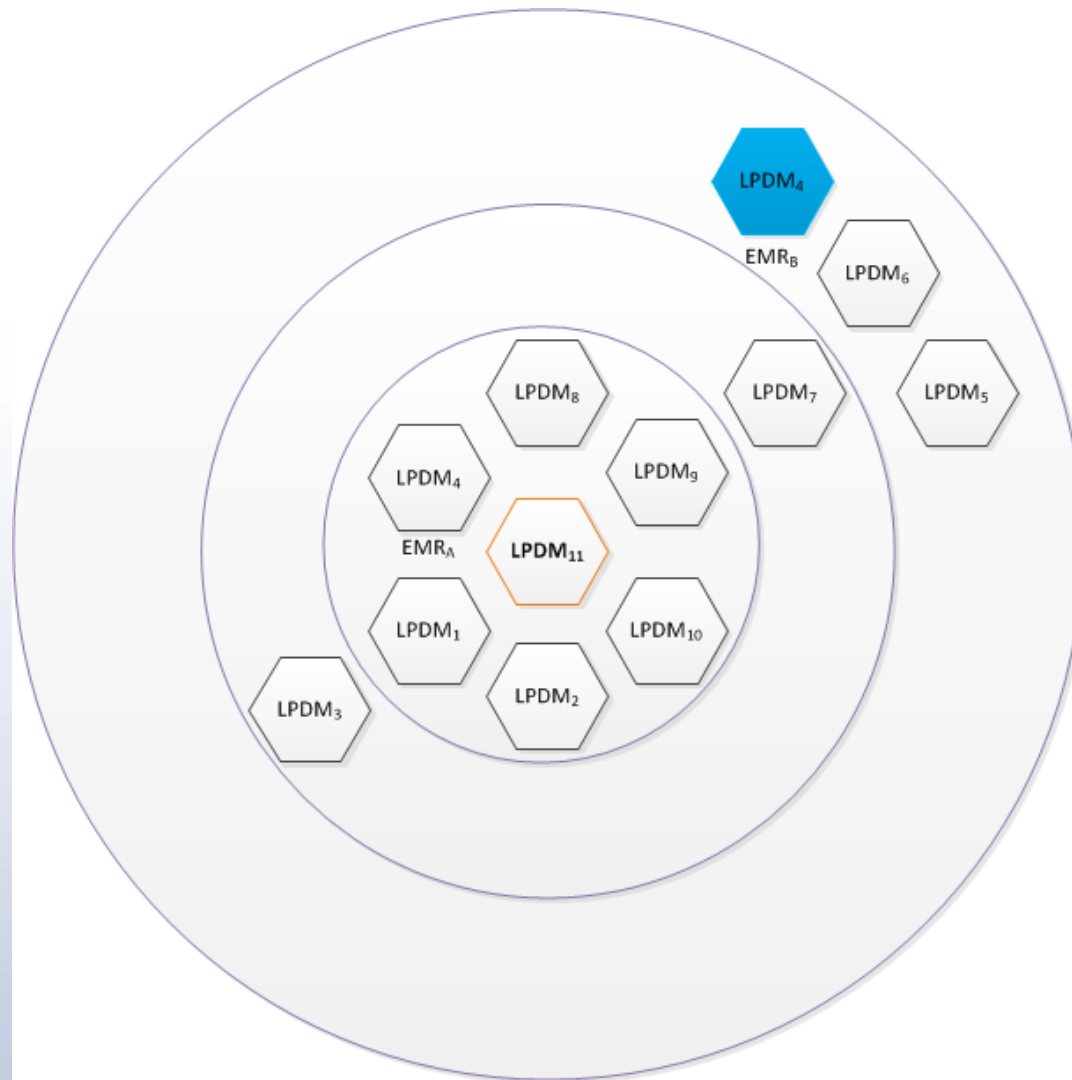

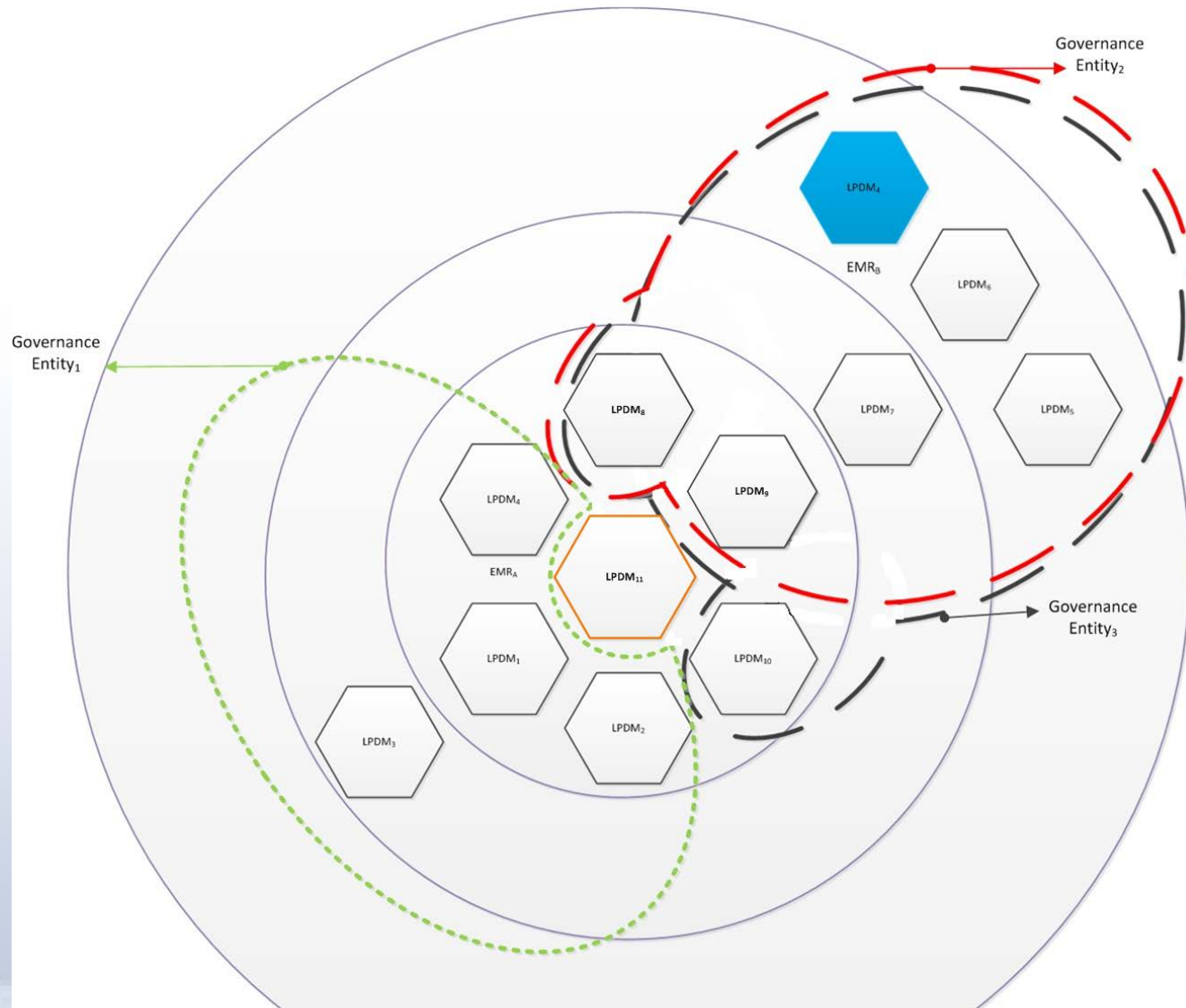


...who has the highest priority to be able to exchange
