

Percent of office-based physicians and acute care hospitals with any EHR



Percent of office-based physician visits and acute care hospital admissions at providers with any EHR



"Any EHR" is a medical or health record system that is either all or partially electronic (excluding systems solely for billing). In 2010, the share of physician visits to physicians with any EHR (53%) was the same as the share of physicians with any EHR (52%); the projected 2013 estimate assumes this same pattern.


Person perspective
