## **Future Scenario-Based Testing Development**

- ONC's plan for developing further scenarios is based on a clinically-plausible workflow that:
  - (Group 1) Follows a patient from contact with an EP or EH through care and follow-up (Available October 2013)
  - (Group 2) Follows an EP or EH from patient care through public health and clinical quality measure reporting (Available Early 2014)
  - Includes all of the 2014 Edition EHR Certification Criteria
  - Develops into a library of testing scenarios
  - Will be developed and created by multiple sources and vetted and approved by ONC
